THE DEATH OF A LOVED ONE

At some point, every family has to face the reality that life ends. Sometimes it is as the result of an illness, or after a long life, but sometimes it happens suddenly, with no time to prepare.

HEARING THE NEWS

When a death occurs, the immediate family has the task of letting other family members and friends know what has happened. This is often when the fact that a loved one has died begins to sink in.

FAMILY GATHERS

Often the family home becomes a busy place, as family members gather to make pressing decisions about what should be done next.

Usually around this time the family meets with one of our funeral directors, either at the funeral home, or at the family's home, to plan out the details of the funeral.

FRIENDS SUPPORT

As the word spreads, friends surround the family and offer support. People want to offer support by sending flowers or a card, calling, or dropping off a meal.

PUBLIC MOURNING

This is an opportunity for you to invite your community to join you in your grief, to offer support and to remember the deceased. Visitation hours provide a structured time for people to offer condolences to the family. A funeral or memorial service allows for a time to reflect, and to say goodbye. The tone of this service is often impacted by religious beliefs and worldviews held by the deceased and the family.

FINAL GOODBYE

At this point, we say goodbye to the body of our loved one, and begin to realize that life must go on without his or her physical presence.

PRIVATE GRIEVING

Grief does not end with the funeral. The grief a family experiences is very real and will last a long time. Often this is done in private, with close family and friends offering support. Many times we will begin to seek support from those who understand.

ADJUSTING TO CHANGE

Life must continue without the person who has died. Slowly a family adjusts to the absence of the deceased. Life changes but it does go on.

Burial Arrangement Options

There are many service options to consider when burial is chosen, depending on your family's wishes for visitation, ceremony or celebration of life. The body may be buried after a visitation and/or service, before a memorial service, or shortly after death.



A) VISITATION AND SERVICE OR CELEBRATION OF LIFE ON TWO SEPARATE DAYS\$6,810


Holding a Visitation and Service allows for you to invite your community to support you in a difficult time. This option allows you plenty of time for friends and relatives to gather. The visitation and service may be held at our facility or place of worship of your choice.

B) VISITATION AND/OR SERVICE OR CELEBRATION OF LIFE ON ONE DAY\$5,420

Sometimes it may make more sense to hold a Visitation and Service on one day, with the visitation leading into the service time. Or you may wish to simply have a service, with no visitation time, or to have a visitation with no formal service. This event may be held at our funeral home or a facility or place of worship of your choice.

C) PRIVATE FAMILY GOODBYE - GRAVESIDE SERVICE\$3,990

It is always helpful to allow time for your family to say goodbye. This includes a small gathering for immediate family at the funeral home, prior to a Graveside Service.



Cremation Arrangement Options

Families choosing cremation have many service options available to them. One important decision to make is whether the cremation will take place before or after a visitation, service or celebration of life. When cremation takes place after services, the body is placed in a casket (purchased or rented), and following the visitation and/or service, is brought to the crematorium. When cremation takes place prior to visitation or service, the body is brought for cremation soon after the death takes place, and an urn is present for visitation, service or celebration of life.

A) VISITATION AND SERVICE ON TWO SEPARATE DAYS

B) VISITATION AND SERVICE ON ONE DAY

Sometimes it may make more sense to hold a Visitation and Service on one day, with the visitation leading into the service time. Or you may wish to simply have a service, with no visitation time, or to have a visitation with no formal service. This event may be held at our funeral home or a facility or place of worship of your choice.

C) CELEBRATION OF LIFE GATHERING

- FAMILY CENTRE \$4,525

The Family Centre is the ideal location to host an "open house" with the added comfort of favourite foods and beverages (LCBO licensing included). The option of sharing photos, memorabilia, music and tributes is available, either in an informal and spontaneous setting or at a specific time set aside for eulogies.

D) PRIVATE FAMILY GOODBYE

- FOLLOWED BY CREMATION\$3,170

It is always helpful to allow time for your family to say goodbye. This includes a small gathering for immediate family at the funeral home, prior to cremation.

E) CREMATION WITH GRAVESIDE SERVICE.....\$2,640

For those wishing to have a graveside service following cremation, where a ceremony is held when the urn is placed in the ground, or in a columbarium niche, or the cremated remains are scattered.

F) SIMPLY CREMATION\$2,270

For those wishing no public or private ceremony, this option includes basic professional services to facilitate cremation.



Itemized List

ALL OF OUR SERVICES INCLUDE our complimentary "Family Care" to assist you with the many details that need to be dealt with after the funeral and our complimentary DVD tribute to the memory of your loved one.

BASIC PROFESSIONAL FEES\$1,095

Professional consultation with licensed personnel, which may include but is not limited to: expert advice on options to meet your needs, including essential services relating to disposition, drafting notices, planning scheduling of services and advising regarding possible government benefits. Includes provincial licensing costs and proportionate share of taxes to all levels of government. A basic professional fee is payable whenever we provide services to you.

COORDINATING RITES AND CEREMONIES\$250

Co-ordination of all rites and ceremonies before, during and after they have been provided, including services and supplies provided by us, as well as those provided by third party suppliers, such as flowers and death notices.

DOCUMENTATION\$295

Completion and filing of all documents

necessary to carry out the services and supplies requested, including, but not limited to: death registration, burial permit, coroner's certificate for cremation and documentation necessary to ship the body out of the country. As part of this service, we will provide you with proof of death certificates; such certificates are usually accepted for most estate settlement purposes, but sometimes a provincial Death Certificate will be necessary and is available from the Office of the Registrar General.

TRANSPORT REMAINS - BASIC \$360

Transportation of the remains from one place to another, for example the hospital to our premises, or from our premises to the cemetery or crematorium using a transfer vehicle, for distances not exceeding 50 km.

BASIC PREPARATION\$250

The preparation of the body for placement into the casket, including bathing, dressing and the setting of facial features

for identification or viewing without embalming.

EMBALMING.....\$295

Embalming is the process of replacing blood and bodily fluids with chemical preservatives. It is a process of sanitation, restoration and temporary preservation. Embalming is not legally required, but may be recommended to preserve the body between the time of death and the visitation or disposition of the deceased. Our professional funeral directors will make a recommendation based on the condition of the body and expected service needs.

STAFF SERVICES – CEREMONY.....\$595/\$995

(On-site/Off-site) Staff to coordinate and oversee the Ceremony or Memorial at our premises. If the Ceremony or Memorial takes place at an off-site location, an equipment charge and additional staff services charges will apply in lieu of and equivalent to facility use fees.

STAFF SERVICES – RECEPTION.....\$200

Staff services in preparation for, during, and after the Reception time.

FUNERAL CELEBRANT.....\$300

Staff service provided to plan, lead, host and coordinate the details of the Service or Ceremony.

FACILITIES - PREPARATION / EMBALM / SHELTER \$160 / \$195

Facilities used to prepare, embalm and/or shelter the deceased; this charge applies whenever the deceased is in our facility for any purpose.

FACILITIES – VISITATION\$795

A room or rooms for the reception of family or friends during the Visitation period, which includes use of a coffee lounge.

FACILITIES – SERVICE\$795

Use of our chapel and equipment for one hour prior to the Funeral Service in addition to the service time.

FACILITIES – RECEPTION.....\$395

Use of reception facilities following the Funeral Service or Ceremony including hot and cold refreshments, dishes, napkins and table linens.

MEMORIAL STATIONERY\$325

Personalized guest register book, cards, thank you notes, laminated obituary bookmarks and service folders including all design and printing.

VEHICLES – LEAD / CLERGY / INTERMENT.....\$175

A vehicle used to drive the clergy where necessary and/or to escort the funeral procession to the place of final disposition and/or to meet the family for a graveside service.

VEHICLES - LIMOUSINE\$310

A limousine to accommodate family or pallbearers on the day of the Service or Ceremony.

VEHICLES – SUBSEQUENT TRANSFER OF REMAINS \$385 / \$595

A vehicle for transfer of the deceased to the place of Service or Ceremony and/or the cemetery or crematory.

VEHICLES – UTILITY VAN......\$95

A general purpose vehicle to transfer equipment or flowers to the place of the Service or Ceremony and/or to the cemetery or other local delivery location.

EQUIPMENT FOR OFF-SITE SERVICES\$300 / \$430

The provision of funeral equipment for Visitation and/or Ceremony provided off-site.

PACEMAKER REMOVAL.....\$50

The removal and disposal of a pacemaker when required prior to cremation.

CHAPEL MUSICIAN.....\$175

Services of a musician provided by the funeral home for accompaniment during a service.



Are you thinking of Burial?



We would be honoured to assist you in arranging for burial, and in selecting cemetery property.

SOME FACTS ABOUT BURIAL:

The body is buried in a casket, and the casket may be placed in a concrete liner or a vault. The body can be buried shortly after death, after a visitation and/or funeral service, or before a memorial service. The body may be buried in the ground, or entombed in a mausoleum. Embalming is not required for burial, but may be recommended, depending on the visitation and funeral arrangements.

DO I NEED TO PURCHASE A VAULT?

Some cemeteries either require or recommend purchasing a vault or cemetery liner to enclose the casket in the ground. This offers protection from the weight of the earth, and in the case of sealing vaults, protection from the elements in the ground.

PLANNING AHEAD

We believe it is a good idea to select burial plots ahead of the time of need if possible. Selecting a final resting place for a loved one is an important decision that we can help you with. We have information available for all cemeteries in the area and can provide



you with comparisons so that you can make a decision that fits both your wishes and your budget. Please give us a call or send us an email if you would like any information about cemeteries in your area. In addition we can help you with designing and installing a fitting tribute in the way of a memorial monument or marker.

WHAT MEMENTOS OR PERSONAL ITEMS CAN BE PLACED IN A CASKET PRIOR TO BURIAL?

Any personal items can be placed in the casket, like notes or photos, which can be a helpful way to say goodbye. We will ask you whether any jewelry or mementos placed with your loved one during the visitation should be left with the person, or returned to the family. If desired, we can donate eyeglasses to charity.

ARE KEEPSAKES FOR CREMATION ONLY?

Some people find it helpful to have a part of their loved one to keep with them, as a special way to remember them. This is possible if you choose burial as well as cremation. Instead of cremated remains, a lock of hair can be enclosed for safekeeping, or a special note or photo. We have jewelry options that can incorporate your loved one's fingerprint or lockets that will hold an important photo. Ask one of us to tell you about the many options available.

Are you thinking of Cremation?

We would be honoured to assist you in arranging for cremation. We wish to share some information about cremation with you.

THE CREMATION PROCESS

Cremation involves reducing the body to bone fragments by applying intense heat (approximately 1000 degrees Celsius) for a period of two to three hours. The cremated remains, which are commonly referred to as ashes, are removed from the cremation chamber, and any metal objects are removed. The cremated remains are then processed, so that they are of an equal consistency. They will often appear white or grey in colour, and typically weigh between 1 to 2 kilograms.



WHAT MEMENTOS OR PERSONAL ITEMS CAN BE PLACED IN A CASKET PRIOR TO CREMATION?

Any personal items can be placed in the casket, like notes or photos, which can be a helpful way to say goodbye. Since most items will be destroyed as part of the cremation process, we suggest that jewelry be removed and placed inside the urn with the cremated remains after the cremation has taken place.

WHAT FUNERAL SERVICES CAN BE SELECTED IF CREMATION IS CHOSEN?

Cremation does not limit the funeral services that may be chosen. The same options available with earth burial are available with cremation. Some of these

choices include the type of casket, having on open casket viewing or visitation, location of service, and type of funeral or memorial service. Ask one of us if you have any questions about this.

OUR CREMATORIUM

We will arrange cremation with any crematorium, but we suggest Evergreen Crematorium, located on the grounds of the Milton Evergreen Cemetery. We, along with many other family-owned funeral homes, are part owners of the crematorium, and we feel that Evergreen can best serve the needs of your family. The crematorium is located in a beautiful building, which has a chapel that can seat up to 50 people for a ceremony.

ATTENDING THE CREMATION

We are used to being present for the burial of a loved one, but have you considered attending the cremation? Some families find it beneficial to accompany us to the crematorium, and to have a goodbye ceremony in the Evergreen Crematorium Chapel, as a way of seeing the process through. If desired, you may even witness the beginning of the cremation process in a respectful manner. The drive from Waterdown to Milton is a beautiful one that takes us through the countryside north of Burlington. Many families have appreciated accompanying their loved one for a final journey. Ask your funeral director about how this might work for your family.

WHAT IS A FUNERAL CELEBRANT?

A Celebrant is a person who is trained and certified to meet the needs of families during their time of loss. A Celebrant serves by providing a funeral service that is personalized to reflect the personality and life-style of the deceased.

WHY USE A CERTIFIED CELEBRANT?

The training for Celebrants established by the In-Sight Institute seeks to provide the most comprehensive and sensitive training available. It is important that you and your family know that you are being served by someone who understands the process and is prepared to offer the very best service possible.

WHAT DOES A CERTIFIED CELEBRANT OFFER THE FAMILY?

A Celebrant has been specifically trained to design a service for your loved one that is completely personal, incorporating those unique stories, songs and experiences that defined the loved one. A Celebrant will schedule a special Family Time for your family to share memories, anecdotes and special moments in the loved one's life. The essence of the service will be based upon the remembrances of the family. The Celebrant will consult with you to help design a service that best reflects and memorializes the life of your loved one. The Celebrant can serve at a funeral service, memorial service, graveside service, anniversary tribute, tree planting, bench dedication or any other gathering designed to honour the deceased.

WHAT IS THE COST?

The Celebrant will spend approximately 10 hours in preparation for your service as well as the expense of maintaining a resource library and on-going training. The average cost for the Funeral Celebrant Services is \$300 plus H.S.T. and may be added to your funeral service account.

Casket Selection

The two main purposes of a casket are to provide the primary protection of the deceased in burial, and to act as a focal point during the services. Therefore, choosing the right casket for yourself or a loved one is a very personal decision.

The value, selection and cost of caskets are affected by a number of factors such as materials of construction, design details and personalization features. Basically there are two types of caskets – metal and wood.

WOOD

Wood caskets can either be of solid construction, or made of select wood veneers. Most people who choose a wood casket do so because of the warmth and beauty of the wood. In fact, no two wood caskets are identical, since the graining patterns are unique to each one.

METAL

Those who choose metal caskets typically value the protective qualities they offer, as well as the various colours, styles and ornamentation options available.



Natural Burial

A natural burial is an alternative to traditional burial, allowing the body to return to the earth as naturally as possible. The natural burial section at Mt. Hamilton Cemetery offers a special area where this is possible, while also maintaining a natural ecosystem. The area's habitat and ecosystem will be enhanced over time.

The natural burial section will allow a simple wood or wicker casket without any metal or chemical finishes to be used. The body must be embalmed with plant based embalming fluids, or unembalmed. The gravesite will be unmarked, and a common memorial will be offered.

The natural burial section allows the burial of a biodegradable urn, or scattering of the cremated remains. The gravesite or scattering area will be unmarked, and a common memorial will be offered.



SCATTERING

Scattering the cremated remains of a loved one is a big decision as it cannot be reversed. Cremated remains are not light weight like wood ash, but are weighty and granular, more like fine gravel. This should be taken into account when scattering as they should not be left on the surface but turned under the ground. Your own private property may be used for scattering, but other's property is off limits. Common land can be used for this purpose with discretion. This is a decision that should be discussed with all concerned, and the option of scattering a portion and allowing for the interment of the balance of the cremated remains in a cemetery where your loved one can be memorialized is worth consideration.

Most urns are also available in a smaller keepsake size as a way of keeping a portion of remains if burial or scattering is chosen.



Documents Required for Family Care Appointment
