After 24 years, he finished his teaching career at L.P. Miller Comprehensive High School in Nipawin, SK. Larry and Bernadette moved to Saskatoon after retirement, where he enjoyed being closer to his brothers, sister and numerous nieces and nephews. Larry had the entrepreneurial spirit and valued his vending business until selling in 2019 when he fully retiring at 76 years young. He also loved playing the accordion, reading, fishing and camping. His favourite pastime was spending time in his garage, where he had many well-organized tools. He taught himself lathe woodworking and built a bandsaw from scratch and if he couldn't find the right tool, he would make one to suit the purpose. One of Larry's greatest passions was playing cards, he spent many hours playing Kaiser, Schmier and Poker with family and friends.
